2.1 Symbols in this manual

Safety instructions

2.2 Intended use

The device is intended for personal use only. It is not intended for commercial use. The device is solely intended for the following tasks:

- Playback of FM/DAB+/Internet radio and Spotify streaming service.
- Audio playback from external devices connected via AUX In or USB port.
- Audio playback from Bluetooth-enabled devices (e.g. mobile phones).
- Charging of external devices that are connected via the USB port.



Any other use is considered improper use and is prohibited. We assume no liability for damages resulting from improper use.

2.3 Children and persons with limited cognitive abilities

- Do not leave the device unattended and do not use it when children or persons who are unable to judge the associated risks are nearby.
- Persons (including children) who are not able to safely operate the device due to their physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or a lack of experience or knowledge regarding the device, should not operate this device without proper supervision or instruction by a responsible person. Please keep it safely out of their reach.
- Keep batteries out of reach of children. Risk of swallowing! If you notice or suspect that someone has swallowed a battery, seek medical aid immediately.
- Remember that packaging materials should not be toyed with. Risk of suffocation!

2.4 Power supply

The device is powered electrically, so there is always a risk of electric shock. As such, pay particular attention to the following instructions:

- Never touch the power plug with wet hands.
- When you want to pull the power plug from the wall outlet, always pull directly on the plug itself. Never pull on the power cable, as this could damage it.
- Ensure unobstructed access to the power outlet so that the power plug can be pulled out immediately in case of an emergency.
- Make sure that the power cable is not bent, pinched or run over.
 Lay the power cable in such a way that it is not a tripping hazard or within reach of children.
- Keep the device away from rain, moisture and any heat sources.
- Only operate the device if the electrical voltage indicated on the device nameplate and the power plug matches the voltage of your power outlet.
- Incorrect voltage may irreparably damage the device.
- In order to prevent fire hazards, disconnect the device completely from the power supply when you will not be using the device for a



long period of time. Do this by unplugging the power plug from the AC outlet.

- The power adapter is used as a disconnected device, the disconnect device shall remain readily accessible.
- Use only power adapter listed in this manual.

2.5 Batteries

- Never attempt to recharge or open the battery. Explosion hazard!
- Never damage or warp the battery.
- Never throw batteries into an open fire or expose them to high temperatures.
- Failure to observe these guidelines may cause fluid to escape from the battery, which can cause skin irritation. In case of contact:
 - Wash off the fluid with plenty of clear water.
 - Do not rub your eyes. Instead, rinse eyes with plenty of clear water for 10 minutes and seek immediate medical attention.
- Only use batteries of the same or an equivalent type. Explosion hazard!
- Remove the batteries from the battery compartment as soon as they are empty, or if you do not intend to use the device for a long period of time.
- If the battery compartment does not close securely, stop using the product and keep it away from children.
- Take attention to the environmental aspects of battery disposal.

2.6 Transport/shipping

Improper transport/shipping can lead to damage to the device's surface or the media inside it, thus preventing it from working properly.

Personal safety

 Whilst driving in a vehicle, store the device in such a way that it does not endanger the occupants.

Preventing damage to the device

The front, edges and corners of the device are all vulnerable to pressure. Protect these areas to prevent them from being subjected to excessive loads. Never tilt the device over its corners or edges. Never place the device facedown.



- To transport or ship the device, please pack it in the enclosed protective cases and store it in its original packaging. Keep the original packaging for this purpose.
- If you lose the original packaging, use another box of sufficient size for transport. Fill this space with polystyrene.

Protecting the media inside the device

 To avoid damage to the medium inside the device, remove it before transport/shipping.

2.7 Ambient conditions

In order to ensure that the device can be operated safely, certain ambient conditions must be observed.

Weather, moisture and temperatures

- Protect the device and remote control from the weather, moisture and high temperatures. Never use the device outdoors, and never place it in areas with increased exposure to sunlight.
- Protect the device from liquids. Never place objects containing liquids on or next to the device.

Installation location

- Never use the device in areas with high levels of humidity. Protect it from heavy soiling, e.g. splashes of grease and uncleaned extraction air in the kitchen.
- Never place the device on or in the immediate vicinity of fire and heat sources, e.g. burning candles, stove tops or radiators.

Installation surface

- Place the device on a sturdy surface to prevent severe mechanical vibrations.
- Do not place the device on surfaces into which it may sink, as this will obstruct the ventilation openings. This prevents heat from building up inside the device.

Ventilation

- Set up the device in such a way that adequate ventilation is ensured in order to prevent heat form building up inside the device.
- Always keep a minimum distance of 10 cm from other objects or walls.



2.8 Operation

- The rubber feet of the device may produce stains on certain surfaces. Use a suitable surface.
- Do not use any media other than those specified in this manual.
- Never use any power cables other than those permitted. Using the wrong power supply will damage your device.
- To maintain the compliance with the WiFi RF exposure requirement, place the product at least 20 cm (8 inches) from nearby persons except when operating the controls.

2.9 In case of defects

If the device develops a defect, do not attempt to repair it on your own.

- If the power plug, adapter or power cable of this device is damaged, they must be replaced by the manufacturer or the manufacturer's customer service department to prevent risk of electric shock.
- Should any fluid enter the device, or if the device has been dropped or otherwise damaged, have it checked by an authorised dealer.
 Immediately disconnect the device from the power supply and contact an authorised dealer as soon as possible.

2.10 Disposal at end of useful life



Devices that are marked with this symbol (see figure) should not be disposed of in household waste. They must be returned to a collection point for the recycling of electrical and electro-technical devices. Information







4 **Getting started**

A WARNING!

4.1 Unpacking the device

- 1. Take the device of the packaging and check whether the device or the individual parts exhibit damages. If this is the case, do not use the device. Should you detect any damage, contact your dealer or sonoro audio GmbH customer support immediately.
- Check to make sure that the delivery is complete (see chapter "Scope of delivery").
- 3. Place the device at a suitable location (see chapter "Ambient conditions").
- 4. Remove the protective film from the display.



4.2 Connecting the power supply

- Insert the connector of the power adapter into the DC power input jack* on the back of the device.
- 2. Insert the power plug into a wall socket.

The device is turned on.

*Remove the protective cover before inserting the connector.

4.3 Inserting the battery in the remote control

- 1. Open the battery compartment cover on the back of the remote control by turning it anticlockwise using a small coin.
- 2. Insert the supplied batteries (CR2025, 3 V) with the label (+) side up.
- 3. Replace and close the battery compartment cover by turning the cover clockwise using a small coin.

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Do not block the infra-red sensor on the device and the infra-red transmitter on the remote control during use.

4.4 Using the antennas

- 1. Detach the FM/DAB antenna from the catch on the back of the device.
- 2. Lift both FM/DAB antenna and Wi-Fi antenna upwards.
- 3. Extend the FM/DAB antenna for better reception.

4.5 Performing initial setup

When the device is powered on for the first time, the "Setup wizard" appears on the display. Follow the instructions below to configure some basic settings.

1. When the "Setup wizard" is displayed, press ◀ or ▶ on the remote control (or rotate the navigation knob) to select "YES" and then press OK to start the setup.






- 2. You are then prompted to select:
- Language (to be used in the display)
- Time format (12 or 24-hour),
- Source of auto update (Update from radio, Internet or no update).

Depending on the selection you have made, follow the instructions on the display to further set up date and time, time zone, daylight saving or wireless network. Rotate the navigation knob on the device or press the navigation buttons on the remote control to make selections and then press OK to confirm (see chapter "Using the menus").

When update from Internet is selected, Wi-Fi connection must be first established. When entering the key of your wireless network, rotate the navigation knob on the device or press the navigation buttons on the remote control to select a character and then press OK to confirm. To delete the last entry, select [BKSP]. To cancel entering the key, select [CANCEL]. To confirm the entered key, select [OK].



3. When "Setup wizard completed" appears, press OK to exit the setting.



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To run the setup wizard again, go to [System settings] and then select [Setup wizard] (See chapter "System settings").

To control the volume,	Press + or – on the remote control or rotate the volume knob on the device.

To tune to a station,	Press ∢ or ▶ .
To store a radio station in the preset list,	A maximum of 10 radio stations can be stored.

	2. Press + or – (or rotate the navigation knob) to select a preset station number and then press OK to confirm.

To display all available stations.

[Scan]

To scan and store all available stations.

[Manual tune]

To manually tune the frequency. The list of available digital radio ensembles is shown.

[Prune invalid]

To remove all invalid stations from the station list.

[DRC]

Some DAB broadcasts offer dynamic range compression (DRC). Compressing the dynamic range of a radio signal can increase the volume of quiet sounds and reduce the volume of loud sounds. You can select high, low or off level. High level is recommended for noisy environment.



[Station order]

To define how the stations are listed when browsing the station list. Options are:

- [Alphanumeric]: Arrange the stations in alphabetical order,
- [Ensemble]: List groups of stations that are broadcast together on the same ensemble, and
- [Valid]: List valid stations first, then off-air stations.
- [System settings]

See chapter "System settings".

[Main menu]

To access other playback modes, sleep timer or alarms.

10.1 Operation

Wi-Fi Internet connection must be first established to use the Internet radio (see chapters "Performing initial setup" and "Network").

 - [Genre]: To browse and tune to radio stations by genre.

 - [Popular stations]: To browse and tune to the most popular Internet radio stations.
 - [New stations]: To browse and tune to the latest Internet radio stations.
- [Podcasts]
 - [Location]: To browse and tune to podcasts by location.
 - [Genre]: To browse and tune to podcasts by genre.
 - [Search podcasts]: To search for any available podcasts by entering keywords.
- [My Added Stations]

To browse and tune to the radio stations that you have added to "My added stations" on the web portal (See chapter "Using the web portal").

- [Help]
 - [Get access code]: To get the access code of the device.
 - [FAQ]: To get help when the Internet radio does not work properly.

10.4 Using the web portal

The Frontier Silicon Internet Radio portal website allows you to organise your "My favourites" and add new Internet radio stations on a computer. To do so, you need to first register at the web portal.

1. In the Internet radio mode, press SETUP and then go to [Station list] > [Help] > [Get access code]. Write down the access code.



- 2. Go to <u>www.wifiradio-frontier.com</u> on the web browser of your computer.
- 3. Register a new account with the access code.
- 4. Following the instructions in the web portal, use the "My favourites" and "My added stations" features to add radio stations.

The added stations in "My favourites" can be accessed through [My favourites] in the Internet radio mode of the device.

11 Spotify mode

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To play back music available from "Spotify", you need to install the "Spotify" application onto your mobile phone, set up an account and purchase the premium version (fee-charging). Also your mobile phone must be registered in the same Wi-Fi network as this device.

To access the Spotify mode,	Press MENU once, then ◀or ▶ (or rotate the navigation knob) to select the Spotify mode and then press OK to confirm.
To select an item (song, album etc.) and start playback in Spotify,	Use the Spotify application on your mobile phone to browse and select a playback item.
To play back Spotify through the device,	Select the speaker symbol (ⓐ) next to the playback item on Spotify. Then select "sonoroSTREAM" from the list of available devices.



To pause or resume playback,	Press ▶II.
To skip to the previous or next playback item,	Press ∢ or ▶ .

12 Music player mode

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The music player mode can play back audio files stored on a connected USB memory stick or from a media server (UPnP) sharing the same Wi-Fi network with the device.

12.1 Operation

To access the Music player mode,	Press MENU once, then ◀ or ▶ (or rotate the navigation knob) to select the music player mode and then press OK to confirm.	
To play back audio files stored on a USB memory stick,	Connect the USB memory stick to the USB port* of the device. Then press SETUP and select [USB playback] from the setup menu (see chapter "Setup menu" on next page).	
	*Remove the protective cover before connecting the USB memory stick.	
To pause or resume playback,	Press ▶¶.	
To skip to the previous or next audio file,	Press ◀ or ▶.	
To quickly search backward or forward within an audio file,	During playback, press and hold ◀ or ▶.	



To add an audio file to "My playlist",	Press and hold ►II or the navigation knob when the file is highlighted in the selection menu.
To select a playback mode,	Press ☆ repeatedly. ■
To browse the information (if available) of the audio file,	Press INFO repeatedly.

12.2 Setup menu

Press SETUP in the music player mode to access the setup menu (see chapter "Using the menus"). The following options are available and the current settings (if applicable) are marked with an asterisk (*).

[Shared media]

To search for audio files on the Wi-Fi network.

Once a media server has been found, a selection menu will show for selection of audio files for playback from the device.

[USB playback]

To search for audio files on the connected USB memory stick.

Once a USB memory stick has been found, a selection menu will show for selection of audio files for playback from the device.

[My playlist]

To browse and play back audio files stored in "My playlist".

[Repeat play]

To turn on or off the repeat playback mode of the current folder/playlist.

[Shuffle play]

To turn on or off the shuffle playback mode of the current folder/playlist.



[Clear my playlist]

To clear entries from "My playlist".

[Prune servers]

If this setting is set to "YES", inactive media servers will be displayed. You can then select a media server and "wake it up" (WOL "wake on LAN" function) in order to play back audio files from the device.

[System settings]

See chapter "System settings".

[Main menu]

To access other playback modes, sleep timer or alarms.

13 Auxiliary input mode

13.1 Operation

Your external player (e.g. mp3 player) must be connected to the auxiliary input jack* of the device through an audio cable (with 3.5 mm connector, not supplied).

To access the auxiliary input mode,	Press MENU once, then ◀ or ▶ (or rotate the navigation knob) to select the auxiliary input mode and then press OK to confirm.
To start and control playback,	Perform all playback operations on the external player.
To mute or restore the sound output,	Press ▶II.

[System settings]

[Main menu]

To access other playback modes, sleep timer or alarms.



14 Bluetooth audio mode

The device can connect to Bluetooth-enabled players (e.g. mobile phone) within a range of approximately 10 meters (30 feet).

14.1 Pairing

- 1. Press MENU once, then ◀ or ▶ (or rotate the navigation knob) to select the Bluetooth audio mode and then press OK to confirm.
 - The smaller Bluetooth icon () is blinking, indicating that the device is ready for pairing.
- 2. On your Bluetooth-enabled player, turn on the Bluetooth function and search for available Bluetooth devices.
- 3. Select "sonoroSTREAM" in the list of available Bluetooth devices to start pairing.

The Bluetooth icon () stops blinking when pairing is complete.

14.2 Operation

To access the Bluetooth audio mode,	Press MENU once, then ◀ or ▶ (or rotate the navigation knob) to select the Bluetooth audio mode and then press OK to confirm.	
To start playback,	Select an audio file from your Bluetooth- enabled player and start playback.	
To pause or resume playback,	Press ▶II.

To disconnect the Bluetooth connection,	 Switch to another playback mode, or Select [BT disconnect] from the setup menu (see below), or

14.3 Setup menu

Press SETUP in the Bluetooth audio mode to access the setup menu (see chapter "Using the menus"). The following options are available and the current settings (if applicable) are marked with an asterisk (*).

[BT disconnect]

To disconnect the Bluetooth connection.

[System settings]

See chapter "System settings".

[Main menu]

To access other playback modes, sleep timer or alarms.

15 Alarms

15.1 Setting alarms

You can set up two alarms.

1. Press and hold **4** to access the alarm setting mode.

Alternatively, press SETUP in any playback mode and then select [Main menu] and then [Alarms].

You may also access the alarm setting mode when the device is in the standby (off) mode. To do so, press and hold \P or press SETUP.

- 2. Select the alarm you want to set (Alarm 1 or 2) and then press OK.
- 3. The following options show for setting the alarm. Rotate the navigation knob or press the navigation buttons to perform the settings (see chapter "Using the menus").
- [Enable]

To turn on or off and set frequency of the alarm. The following options are available:

- [Off]: To deactivate the alarm.
- [Daily]: The alarm activates everyday.
- [Once]: The alarm activates once only.
- [Weekends]: The alarm activates on Saturdays and Sundays.
- [Weekdays]: The alarm activates from Monday to Friday.



[Time]

To set the alarm time.

[Mode]

To select the alarm sound source. The following options are available:

- [Buzzer]
- [Internet radio]
- [DAB]
- [FM]
- [Preset]

To select the last listened station or a preset station as the alarm sound source. This only shows when Internet radio, DAB or FM is selected in [Mode].

[Volume]

To set the volume of the alarm sound.

[Save]

To save the current settings.

Once [Save] is selected, the alarm settings will be stored. If an alarm is activated, the corresponding alarm icon (will show.

15.2 Turning the alarms on or off in standby mode

■ When the device is in the standby (off) mode, press **4** repeatedly to cycle through the alarm on or off settings.

When an alarm is turned on, the corresponding alarm icon (Q)/Q) will show.

15.3 Deactivating a sounding alarm

15.4 Snooze

- To temporarily silence (default: 10 min) a sounding alarm, press ► or the navigation knob.
- Press + or (or rotate the navigation knob) to change the snooze period (5, 10, 15 or 30 min).
- During the snooze period, the alarm icon will blink and the remaining snooze time will show.
- To cancel the snooze function, press (or ♠.

16 Sleep timer

The sleep timer sets the duration of time before the device turns off automatically.

- 1. Press SETUP in any playback mode and then select [Main menu] and then [Sleep].
- 2. Press + or (or rotate the navigation knob) to select a sleep timer (5, 10, 15, 30, 45, 60, 90, 105 or 120 min).
- Press OK to confirm the selection.

When the sleep timer is active, the sleep timer icon (\P) and the remaining time will show. To cancel the sleep timer, press \circlearrowleft .

17 System settings

17.1 Accessing the system settings

- Press SETUP in any playback mode and then select [System settings].
- Refer to the chapters below for details of each setting option. The current settings (if applicable) are marked with an asterisk (*).
- See chapter "Using the menus" for browsing and making selections in the system settings.

17.2 Equaliser

- Select one of the sound equaliser options including: [Normal], [Bath], [Jazz], [Rock], [Movie], [Classic], [Pop], [News], [My EQ] and [My EQ profile setup].
- [My EQ profile setup] allows you to set your own bass and treble levels.



17.3 Network

[Network wizard]

To establish network connection.

[PBC Wlan setup]

Select this option if your wireless router supports both WPS and PBC setup methods.

[View settings]

To view the current network information.

[Wlan region]

To select a Wlan region.

[Manual settings]

Under the [Wireless] option, select [DHCP enable] to allocate IP address automatically or [DHCP disable] to do it manually.

[NetRemote PIN setup]

To set up a NetRemote PIN.

[Network profile]

To display a list of networks saved by the device.

[Clear network settings]

To clear all network settings.

[Keep network connected]

To keep the network connected. This allows you to wake the device from standby using a remote app.

17.4 Time/date

[Set Time/Date]

To set time and date.

[Auto update]

To select a source (Radio, Internet network or no update) for automatic time update.

If you are updating time from a source (Radio – FM/DAB), the daylight saving setting has no effect.



If you are updating time from the Internet network, set your time zone.

[Set format]

To set 12 or 24-hour time format.

[Set timezone]

To set a time zone.

[Daylight savings]

To enable or disable daylight saving time.

17.5 Inactive standby

 This option sets the duration of time before the device turns off automatically. Options include: Off, 2, 4, 5 and 6 hours.

17.6 Language

 This option sets the menu language. Options include: English, German, Danish, Spanish, French, Italian, Dutch, Norwegian, Polish, Portuguese, Finnish, Swedish and Turkish.

17.7 Factory reset

 This option clears all user-defined settings and replaces them with the original default settings.

17.8 Software update

[Auto-check setting]

To set to periodically check for update.

[Check now]

To check for update immediately.

If a new software is available, the device will ask if you want to proceed with an update.

Before software upgrade, make sure that the device is connected to a stable power connection. Disconnecting power during a software update may damage the device.

17.9 Setup wizard

To perform initial setup (see chapter "Performing initial setup").



17.10 Info

 This shows the current software version, spotify version, radio ID and friendly name.

17.11 Backlight

[Dimmer level]

To select the brightness level of the display. Options include: [High], [Medium], [Low] or [Auto].

If [Auto] is selected, the brightness level is automatically adjusted according to the ambient light sensor at the front of the device.

17.12 Multi-room

Your device can be used with other compatible products as part of a multi-room system. Products under the same Wi-Fi network and synchronised in the same multi-room group can play the same content around your home. You may also create multiple groups for different areas of the home or for different users.

You can configure the multi-room groups in the system settings with the following options:

[View details]

To view your current multi-room status:

- [Ungrouped]: The device is not part of a group.
- [Server]: The device sends audio content to other group members.
- [Client]: The device receives audio content from another product in the group.
- [Create new group]

To create a new multi-room group.

[Add to group]

To add other compatible products to a current multi-room group.

[List current clients]

To view the list of compatible products receiving audio contents from the device.



[Leave group]

To remove compatible products from a multi-room group.

[Dissolve group]

To dissolve a multi-room group. Each product in the group will then be operated individually.

18 Using UNDOK[™] app to control the device

The device is compatible with the Frontier Silicon's UNDOK™ app. The app offers comprehensive remote control functionality for FS based audio modules with an iOS or Android smart device.

To install and use the UNDOK™ app:


1. Download the UNDOK™ app from "App Store" or "Google play" and install it on your iOS or Android smart device.

- 3. Launch the UNDOK™ app on your smart device. The app will search for compatible audio systems. You may also tap on "Set up audio system" to start searching for audio systems.



19 Troubleshooting

Malfunctions can occur with any electrical equipment. This is not necessarily due to a device defect. As such, you should check the following table to see if you can eliminate the problem yourself.

Malfunction	Possible cause	Solution
No power	Power cable is not properly connected.	Connect the power cable properly.
No response from the device	There is an error in the device.	Disconnect and reconnect the power plug. Then turn the device on again.
Remote control does not work, or only works sporadically	Distance to the device is too large.	Reduce the distance between the remote control and device.
	Battery is empty.	Replace the battery.
No sound or poor sound	Sound is turned off.	Adjust the volume.
	Device is not set to the correct playback mode.	Select another playback mode.
	FM/DAB or Internet reception is poor.	Extend/adjust the FM/DAB antenna or check the Wi-Fi connection.
	There is radio interference.	Keep the device away from other electronic devices.
Alarm does not work.	Alarm is not activated.	Activate the alarm.
	Alarm volume is set too low.	Increase the alarm volume.
Insufficient Wi-Fi signal strength	The router is too far or blocked.	Place the device closer to the router or adjust the position of the Wi-Fi antenna.



Malfunction	Possible cause	Solution
Cannot connect to your Wi-Fi network	Router is not switched on or working properly.	Switch on your router or check the router conditions.
	Setup method is incorrect.	Check if your router supports WPS and uses the correct setup method (PBC or PIN).
		Configure the Wi-Fi settings again.
Internet radio station does not work sometimes.	Some stations only support a limited number of listeners.	Try again later.
	Station is not broadcasting.	Try again later.
Some Internet radio stations disappear from the station list.	The station is removed from the list when it stops broadcasting.	Check again later. If the station broadcasts again, it will be brought back to the list.

20 Cleaning
